

## JoJo's House: The Next Step

"The Epistles of St. James and St. John remind us, if you're going to be talking about love, if you're going to be talking about anything with love, ultimately you've got to do it. I don't want to talk about the homeless, I want to impact them in some way," said Fr. Philip Schmitter, Pastor of Christ the King Catholic Church, in Flint. JoJo's House, an initiative directed by members of Christ the King, is going to make a BIG impact on homeless families' lives. It will be used as a transitional rental-home opportunity for Family

Promise of Genesee County graduates. The first family will be placed this spring. JoJo's House, named after the late Sr. Joanne Chiaverini, is a single-family home located near Christ the King. Chiaverini, a Sister with the Immaculate Heart of Mary Order, spent 40 years in service to the Flint community. Her nickname JoJo, was bestowed by the dozens of children whose lives she helped change. So, it was fitting this project be named for her. Fr. Schmitter purchased the home back in 2008, from a parishioner who was

moving south. Schmitter says Nina Poole is a wonderful, outgoing, joyful woman and is excited that this is going to happen in the home where she raised her children. Soon after purchasing the home, Schmitter sold it to the St. Francis Prayer Center, just outside Flint. The Prayer Center is an endeavor began by Chiaverini to offer a place of retreat, spiritual refreshing and guidance for all denominations. Today the house is being renovated for the incoming FPGC graduate family. Schmitter says work being

done is thanks to many community partners, not only Christ the King members and the staff at the St. Francis Prayer Center, but "We're very pleased that the Community Foundation of Greater Flint was willing to give us a \$5,000 grant and the Sisters of the Living Word, in honor of the 40th anniversary of their existence, gave us \$1,000." Chiaverini's late sister also donated seed money to help JoJo's House become a reality.
