A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR Tiffani Ferrier

Greetings!

I hope this finds you and yours healthy and happy! WOW! Right?

First, let me say Thank You!

Thank you to all of our volunteers for your contribution to our organization during this difficult time.

While most of you were sheltering in place, doing your part to contain the spread of COVID-19, we here at Family Promise of

Genesee County continued to do what we do

best-house families!

We have been able to continue our work helping families that need us because of the support from our Church Coordinators, Board Members, and the outstanding businesses who are so

Like most non-profits and social service agencies, we have spent the last couple of months adapting and to the new normal. Early on, it did not look anything like our traditional host week. We tried hosting from motels. While that was ok, long-term, it was costprohibitive and felt transactional (giving only meals and supplies) not at all our nurturing "hospitable" environment. We transitioned back to the Day Center to discover that it is small when you combine staff and three families with two babies and two toddlers between them, and social distancing. Not to mention cooking with no stove—though one of our moms was extremely creative with the hot plate and two electric skillets that were donated. It was not the right long term solution in addition to being very expensive to pay staff overnight.

There were many discussions - we asked questions like: How can we still serve and be safe? How will we engage our volunteer network, who has been with us side by side, investing in our community and mission?

While our approach has had to make some dramatic changes, it has taught us many things. Nicole and I have been busy working on many new programs and developing those that didn't previously have our full attention. Necessity is always the mother of

On Tuesday, September 21st, the FPGC Education Lab opened. We repurposed the Play Room and outfitted it with 10 computers with webcams for distance learning. School-age kids of our program will have first dibs, and then it will be available to any McKinney-Vento student within the GISD. Our partnership with the McKinney-Vento Service Specialist at GISD will also coordinate educational/school supplies, snacks, and refreshments. If you are interested in volunteering your time in the lab, please let us know.

Hello Friends,

It is our hope that you and your family are healthy and safe. These last few months have been challenging and full of unknowns and questions.

The good news is that our work continues! While we have only had 6 families graduate from our emergency shelter program this year, our other programs are exploding with activity and service. Through, Promise for Home, our eviction prevention and stabilization program, we have helped 97 families comprised of 272 children. These families certainly need us now more than ever before; sure, it is not the same sort of help that our mission was founded,

but very valuable.



Like many other nonprofit agencies and churches, more than 72% of us have suffered financially due to the pandemic. Not being able to host our Annual 5K was certainly disappointing. Thankfully, Tiffani is a whiz managing our expenses, and leveraging community partners; her ingenuity has saved us more than \$2,800 in van repairs alone, to date, we have spent only \$170,000 of our \$212,665 annual budget. In turn, we put the money right back where it belongs -

serving our community.

Should gathering restrictions continue, we have several back -up plans to allow us to once again host families. Our programs have been adapted, and we have taken the time to explore innovative solutions to keep our volunteers safe.

Tiffani and Nicole have been working on quarterly plans that involve us hosting families either in a large single-family house or apartments until it is safe for us to gather once again. We are waiting on replies to our grant requests to put these plans in motion. These options will reserve the Day Center for Case Management and our new Education Lab.

Last year you may remember us talking about our eviction prevention program, *Promise for Home.*

We served two families with funds from it in 2019, and since March, we have helped 10 families, preventing 21 kids from ever knowing the trauma of homelessness. Now, we are part of the Genesee County multiagency network helping people facing a housing crisis due to the pandemic. But don't worry—we are staying true to our mission of helping children and their families. Any assistance we offer is paid directly to the landlord, and all families enter our graduate program, Beyond the Promise.

We provide the same help and guidance that we would to an emergency housing graduate - case management, monthly budgeting, access to resources, job skill development, or any other tools necessary to stabilize the family.

Stabilizing households is another place where we have had great success. Through a connection from our friends at Goodrich United Methodist, we have been delivering food and other supplies so far reaching 80 families comprised of 236 kids.

Before the mandatory stay at home order, Nicole had been working on transitioning our application process to an electronic one - the goal was to gather all the information we needed in the first call and shorten the length of time it took to bring in a family.

This transition helped us immensely - since someone was not always at the day center during the first month of the shutdown. Initially, the application went viral on Facebook, and we received more than 100 requests in one day. Now we are averaging 2 -3 applications per day from parents looking for help. Many still need shelter, but more and more are requesting help to prevent a pending eviction.

We are hopeful that we continue to move in the right direction so that we can go back to helping end homelessness...one family at a time.

Until then - thank you for all that you do to keep Family Promise in the hearts and minds of those in your network. Peace, Love, and Housing,

This key ingredient to our programming has never been more important than it is now. Making sure our families are able to maintain their employment is paramount to their

Our last mom, who recently graduated, shared with us that it was the first time she had ever lived in a home, in her life.

Previously, she had lived in apartments or trailers. "The kids really enjoy having a yard to play in and like I can do laundry without having to pack them up on the bus!"

They live very near to the Day Center. It is nice to see them outside riding their bikes in the morning or afternoon.

So far they have outfitted full homes for 5 of our graduates just this year! Washers, dryers, stoves, these items are hard to source and we are so thankful to Deb Hawely and her kind volunteers who drop off the furnishings.



One of the larger things on our annual budget is Transportation.
Insurance, gas, repairs, and maintenance on the van add up fast.

Though we try our best to avoid it, the van is sometimes used to transport furniture and other items when families are moving.

Getting a more economical second vehicle, for quick trips, accepting furniture



donations, and other errands, has been on our wish list for a long time. Other more important items have always come before.

And not a moment too soon as our next wave of outreach begins on October 8th.

homework or zoom for classes and the idea quickly morphed into that we could host training for our parents at the same time. Adults can access can assess Pathways to Workplace Success— a series of workforce development videos. Kids can access Sesame Street in Communities.

Lastly, we will be teaching Keys to

Good Tenancy—our tenant landlord relationship building program. By offering these resources and

By offering these resources and support to our families it is our goal that we will help them navigate and resolve even the smallest

crises so they never experience another eviction or the trauma of homelessness.



Did you know that most of our families spend more than 50% of their income on housing? Through education we hope to educate them reduce the risk of them ever experiencing homelessness.
