We have undergone a tremendous amount of change over the last 12 months, transitioning from a hard-working group of volunteers with a vision to an operating entity providing food and shelter to families in need. This was all made possible due to contributions of precious treasure from people like you. Your generous support has allowed our organization to provide:

- 221 nights of safe lodging to families in their time of greatest need, and more importantly, these nights were spent together as a family.
- 663 meals to families which allowed them to save their earnings to get back on their feet and in their own home.
- Support to three families transition to their own permanent housing with continued aftercare where needed.

We hope to continue to provide a caring environment for families to get back on their feet through the use of our dedicated network of host and support churches and need your continued support to do so.

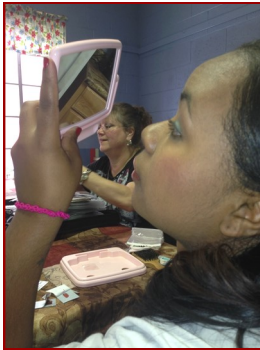
## 13th National Family Promise Conference

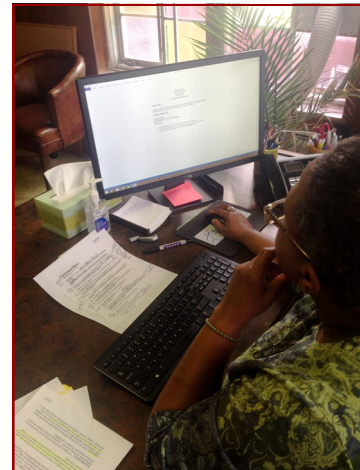
