We never honestly know what our families feel as they make the journey through our program. We didn't find out until Amanda graduated how badly she and her family struggled. As a team, it was eye-opening.

We wanted to know: What could we have done to make them feel better? More welcome? At home? Supported? Loved? Did we not listen because we were rushing around our selves? How could we improve our processes? Our communication? Our kindness? What if it was our own family in their situation?

The team consensus was we need to remember our families are going through the hardest day of their life, **every day**.

BRIDGE APART

Our Board of directors is a passionate group!

After many meetings, discussions, and prayers on the next direction Family Promise would take, we are excited to announce FPGCs Bridge Apart program.

This provides funding, up to \$1,000, available to families who are in both good program standing and meet specific criteria.

These funds can cover expenses like vehicle repairs, rental deposits, and other expenses that would make it possible for families to move into permanent housing with in 45 days. This is substantially faster than our traditional



model which can vary between 60-90 days, but averages 68.9 days.

Often the biggest barrier for our guests to maintain both employment and sustainable housing is a reliable vehicle. Bridge Apart will allow us to help those families graduate faster and begin rebuilding their lives.



The mission of Family Promise and Help Us Move In (HUMI) are very similar—they are working to raise awareness about the growing population of children experiencing

homelessness and iust like us—thev motivate and encourage community support to create sustainable funds that help children and their families maintain stable housing.



We are pleased to announce that we are the latest recipient of this unique matching grant

program. We have begun the work of raising funds that are matched by the community through a series of challenge grants.

This will be our second step



towards providing

stabilization funds and support to those in need.





One of the many benefits of being part of a local affiliate are the resources we receive. Two of those are the Keys to Good Tenancy program that will help our families be better prepared to be good tenants as they graduate from the program.

The curriculum includes budgeting, leases, maintenance/home repairs, neighbor relations, and more. In January of 2020, FPGC's Tiffani Ferrier, along with board member, Shawn Rowden from ReMax Edge in Davison will pair up and begin teaching this curriculum. It will be open to current guests, graduates, and community members.
