## From the Director's Desk

It's hard to believe we're cruising into the summer months but here we are, heading toward May! It's great to have the Day Center windows open for fresh air. As I am writing this, I can hear children outside for recess at St. John Vianney Catholic School, some singing birds and street traffic. To me, those sounds are refreshing. They all remind me of how much life there is around us, even in tough situations such as a housing crisis.

Inside, it's mostly quiet save computer keys clicking, Pandora streaming and an occasional one-year-old outburst. Two out of the three guest-parents are at work. The other guest parent, a father, is here with the one year old, since he has Mondays off from his job. The rest of the children are in school. Those am-

bient noises have been punctuated by a flurry of phone calls, mostly from people who need shelter. Callers share their stories, their journeys, their needs and we record all of the initial information we require for our process. Then, they wait. They wait for us to schedule an interview, wait for follow-up information we may be able to provide them and If our program isn't quite what they need they wait for someone to give them a ray of hope.

Currently, we have space available in our program and a new mom scheduled to come into our program later this week. So, some of those families on our waitlist will hear encouraging news. Other times, we do our utmost best to connect those families with concrete possibilities and leads for resources. All the while, those kids

keep playing, cars keep driving and birds keep chirping, reminding us we're moving forward and changing lives, one family at a time.

I hope to see some new faces volunteering at our Day Center this summer. We are creating some projects and activity opportunities now for those volunteers. Here comes summer!



# Part of a Bigger Picture

Family Promise of Genesee County is part of a bigger, national picture. There are now 200 affiliates nationwide. For the second time since becoming Network Director in September 2014, I had the privilege of taking part in our National Conference. This year it was held in Long Beach, California. The energy and excitement created by hundreds of people committed to a mission, committed to changing lives, all sharing strategy, ideas and struggles is so powerful.

The National Conference engages Directors, Case Managers and Board Members. It offers a little something for everyone. I spent my time focusing on how to grow the opportunities for our guest families and how to expand the network they're connected to, when they graduate. I also learned that Family Promise of Genesee County is putting a lot of the right building blocks in place. When conference presenters talk about a healthy affiliate they talk about actively engaged board members. We have 12 members of our Board of Directors, some of whom have been with us since the beginning and are so excited to see our steady growth. They also talk about establishing a good base of volunteers and we hit the jackpot there! The volunteer door is always open and we have an amazing group of volunteers between our community connections and our host and support churches.

One of the most impactful moments was hearing from a panel of four Family Promise graduates - three moms and

one father. Talk about inspiring! Two of them earned higher education degrees, one is nearly done with her Masters of Social Work. All are gainfully employed, two with the Family Promise affiliates from which they graduated. Each echoed how the network of caring which surrounded and motivated them made more of a difference than any of those volunteers may ever know. They reminded us that homelessness is hard. Homelessness with children is even tougher, but Family Promise provides hope!
