Dear Friend of Family Promise,

First of all, we would like to thank you for your generous support of our organization this year. We have been an operating entity providing food and shelter to families in need for more than 18 months! This was made possible due to contributions of precious time and treasure, from people like you. Whether you made a general contribution, attended and/or sponsored one of our two major fundraisers, volunteered with a host or support congregation or assisted us with a grant, we appreciate your support. While we are currently on a solid financial footing and continue to minimize our expenses through the use of our dedicated volunteer network, we are reaching out to you at this time to request that you prayerfully consider remembering Family Promise of Genesee County in your giving as the end of the year approaches.

Your generous support has allowed our organization to provide the following over the last year:

- 2,944 nights of safe lodging to families in their time of greatest need and, more importantly, these nights were spent together as a family.
- 8,832 meals to families which allowed them to save their earnings to get back on their feet and into their own home.
- Support to 12 families' transitioning to their own permanent housing with continued aftercare where needed.
- Life-skill courses to help graduates successfully maintain a household.

We hope to continue to provide a caring environment for families to get back on their feet through the use of our dedicated network of host and support churches, but need your continued support to do so. The Family Promise model costs 1/3 of what it costs to operate a traditional shelter and more than 90% of our budget is directly related to programming not operating, so your support makes a direct impact on families' lives.

We have six males over the age of 12 on the 'active' side of the board. We've never had this many males! Two of the guys are fathers in a two parent household, the other four are pre-teen and teenaged boys. If Family Promise of Genesee County did not exist, those families would be broken apart, doubled up with others, sleeping in a vehicle or, even worse, on the streets.

But, we do exist! We exist because of generous donors and grant opportunities. So, tonight, those six males will be safe, supported and solidly with their families. All of them are squarely focused on what's next for them; for the dads, building a firm foundation, for the students, maintaining their academics.
